



# Stabilisation of charging prices at publicly accessible charging points

In view of the exceptional rise in electricity prices due to the tense situation on the electricity markets, and the impact of this rise on the charging infrastructure accessible to the public, the Luxembourgish government has introduced a state contribution in order to stabilise the price of charging at publicly accessible charging points located on the Luxembourgish territory.

This measure is automatically applied by all mobility service providers listed in a register kept by the Ministry of Energy and Spatial Planning, from 1 January 2023 until 31 December 2024.

As of 1 September 2023, the amount of the state contribution is 13.9ct/kWh including tax.

## **FAQ**

### Who does the measure apply to?

The measure applies to all customers of mobility service providers listed in the register kept by the Ministry of Energy and Spatial Planning. #### What steps need to be taken?

If your mobility service provider is listed in the register, you do not need to take any steps. The state contribution is automatically deducted from your bill for each charging operation.

### Does the measure also apply if I charge at home?

If you charge your vehicle at home, you benefit from the temporary price reduction for electricity introduced by the government for all customers with an annual consumption of less than 25,000 kWh applicable from 1 January 2023 until 31 December 2023. This measure allows the price of electricity to be stabilised, on average, compared to 2022.

How can I avoid wasting electricity at home?
